


<u>OUR MILITARY</u> that God may watch over our loved ones, protect them and bring them home safely. THE SICK who have

Our conscience can be deformed through our not having used the means to get to know the Faith, or through an ill will dominated by pride, sensuality, and laziness. When Our Lord complains that the Jews were not receiving his message, He particularly notes the deliberate nature of their decision – they did not want to believe and He

in no way accepted that the cause lay in a difficulty outside the will: this is a conscience of their refusal, freely chosen. Why do you not understand what I say? It is because you cannot bear to hear my word. Passions and lack of sincerity with oneself can come to force the intellect to think in a way more easily adapted to one's way of life, or to some defects or bad habits one does not want to give up. In such case there is not good will; the heart is hardened, and conscience begins to drowse, for it no longer points in the right direction, which would lead it to God. It is now like a broken compass, which not only disorientates its owner but can also affect others. The light which is in us does not spring up from within ourselves, from our subjectivity, but from Jesus Christ. I am the light of the world, He has told us, he who follows me will not walk in darkness. His light brightens our consciences; but even more, it can turn us into a light that will illuminate the lives of others. The Lord puts Christians in the world so that, with the light of Christ, we can point the way to others. We will do so by word, but especially through our behavior as regards professional, family and social obligations. Lent is a good time to ask our Lord to help us form our consciences really well, and for us to examine ourselves to see whether we are being radically sincere with ourselves, with God and with those people who in his name have the mission of advising us.
