
TUESDAY EVENING PRAYER GROUP ROSARY AND CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY


In case you are unable to find the requested gift, a gift certificate to Walmart or Kohl's can be purchased for \$20.00. Thank you for your charitable participation.
