FROM YOUR PASTORS

We are grateful to Bishop da Cunha for assigning a co-pastor to our collaborative serving the parishes of Our Lady of Fatima, St. Joseph-St. Therese and St. Mary's. Father Sudhir Nayak ss.cc. has been appointed to serve "in solidum" (together) with Fr. Raposo and will be the Moderator. He is a member of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary and is seeking to become a priest in the Diocese of Fall River. He has assisted in a leadership position with his Community in India. He has served as pastor of Our Lady of the Assumption in New Bedford for six years. His present assignment in the Diocese is as parochial vicar at the parishes of Our Lady of Victory in Centerville and Our Lady of the Assumption in Osterville. The effective date of Fr. Sudhir's appointment is August 18, 2021.

Let us pray for Fr. Sudhir as he prepares for his assignment among us. Let us also welcome him with great joy and assure him of our support in any way possible.

We might also remember the many priests who will be moving to new assignments and continue to pray for vocations.

As announced at our Masses this weekend, following the changes in COVID protocols issued by Governor Baker, Bishop da Cunha has issued guidelines for our return to near-normal beginning May 29.

Here are the key things you need to know.

- 1. Indoor capacity is increased to 100%. This means, no more roped off pews.
- 2. Those who are vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks in church. (However, please feel free to do so if you are more comfortable that way.)
- 3. If you are un-vaccinated, you must continue to wear a mask while inside the church.
- 4. The encouragement of congregational singing will begin.
- 5. For the time being, we will not be going back to the old way of taking up the collection—passing the basket—we will continue with our current system of dropping your offering in the baskets at the entrances of the church. This has been a challenging year financially for all of our parishes. We are so grateful to all who have been able to continue giving. We hope that as more people return to Mass we will find it a bit easier to handle our expenses.
- 6. We will also be holding off on bringing up the gifts each week for safety purposes as well.
- 7. We will not offer each other the Sign of Peace at this time since New Bedford is still in the Red Zone.
- 8. Greeters will continue to offer you hand sanitizer upon entering the Church.
- 9. We continue to ask that you receive Holy Communion in the hand only as we have no way of knowing who is and who is not vaccinated.
- 10. We will continue hearing Confessions in the confessional. However, since the space is so confined, masks should be worn in the confessional.
- 11. Finally, and this is perhaps most important, if you are not feeling well or someone in your family is not feeling well, please remain home. There is never an obligation to attend Mass when one is ill or caring for a sick family member. Keep in mind, Bishop da Cunha has not reinstated the obligation to attend Mass at this time.

We want to express our thanks to each of you as your co-pastors during these difficult months. The protocols that we have had to follow for the safety of everyone have not been easy. They have challenged the way we normally gather for worship and were a difficult adaptation—especially in the beginning. With very little exception, you all adapted to these protocols without grumble and have done what was needed to do so that we could come together in worship safely.

Also, if you are not vaccinated, please take the time to do so. It will make all the difference for you and is one of the most tangible ways that we can "Love one another" during this difficult time.
